

Exploring the Lakes

Year 3

TERM: Autumn 2

Rationale/Hook:

We asked the children and school adults to recall places that they had been on holidays and noticed that not many of us have ever visited The Lake District. We decided to research and explore what this area has to offer and find out as much as we can and then invite parents to school to share this new knowledge of this beautiful National Park.



Lead Subject: Geography

We will be mapping the route from Park Gate to Carlisle, looking at which cities and counties we will pass on the way and revisiting compass direction. We will use maps and atlases and learn how to use 4-figure grid references. We will be learning about the physical geography of glaciers and how they formed the lakes. We will add information to our own maps of The Lake District. In addition to this, we will be exploring the differences between human and physical geographical features and learning about tourism and its impact on the residents and the landscape. We will consider why the Lake District has both National Park and UNESCO World Heritage site status and also look at the importance of farming there.

Lead Subject: English

Using their geographical knowledge, the children will be writing a persuasive and informative leaflet about the Lake District to show the visitors who come to their outcome. They will be using a variety of different sentence types and persuasive devices to help them to do this successfully. This writing will be on-going and added to as we learn more about the area.

We will complete a range of reading activities based on the book 'The Promise,' by Nicola Davies and compare this book to two other texts.

Lead Subject: Science

The children will be studying the weather in the Lake District and how rainfall contributes to the frequently damp conditions. In order to do this, they will be studying the water cycle and the importance of this on the landscape. They will learn the vocabulary of evaporation, precipitation and condensation.

Also, the children will be studying the different types of soils found in the Lake District and other areas and how soil properties can impact farming and tree growth.

Applied Subject: Art

Using illustrations from 'The Promise' by Nicola Davies we will be sketching and painting leaves.

Applied Subject: ICT

We are conducting safe internet searches about tourism in the counties we pass through to the Lake District. We are going to present this information in a Publisher document, including pictures and text.
